Printing Recommendations EXTRAROUGH 2.0

EXTRAROUGH 2.0 is a surface-treated paper. This treatment is important for making it compatible with Inkjet and HP Indigo printers, as well as digital finishing techniques like Scodix.

When printing with Inkjet or Indigo, we tested both coated and uncoated settings and as a result recommend going with the uncoated option. The difference is minimal, but you will notice a slightly wider color range with the uncoated settings.

For offset printing, we suggest using coated settings instead, as they result in a larger color range. If you're printing large solid areas that will come into contact with unprinted pages, we recommend applying a matte (not silk-matte) dispersion coating to prevent an abrasive behavior.

Because rough papers are naturally more prone to scuffing, it is best to use scuff-resistant and fast-drying inks. Compared to the old EXTRAROUGH, ink densities should be reduced - the coated settings usually already support this.
